IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS FOR INCOMING SENIORS

For the 2018-19 school year seniors will need to have proof of a meningococcal (A C W Y) vaccine at age 16 or older to attend school next year. Students must have proof of the vaccination turned into the high school before the start of school in August. You must have the immunization record to the school before the first day of school or your student will not be able to attend. There is no grace period. When scheduling your incoming senior physical, please make sure the student has received the meningococcal (A C W Y) vaccination at age 16 or older and provide a copy to the high school. You may also check with the doctor's office now, and if the student has already had the vaccination please go ahead and have a copy sent to the high school nurse's office. Race Day Schedule

6:45 AM - Registration at the Center Point – Urbana High School (145 Iowa Street, Center Point). Pre-registered competitors for the 5K, Fitness Walk and 1-Mile events will be provided a t-shirt and all registrants will be provided drinks and refreshments. Late and race-day registrants will only receive t-shirts, as they remain available. Any awards/prizes will be distributed following the conclusion of the 1-Mile Fun Run.

7:45 AM – Fitness Walk: A 1.75-mile fitness walk that begins at the high school.

8:00am – 5K: Prizes will be awarded to all winners in the respective age brackets. Kids 12 and under can participate in the 5K, but they must pay the 5K fee versus the 1-Mile Fun Run fee. Award for overall top male and female finishers along with A PAIR OF RUNNING SHOES, medals to top 3 male and female finishers in each age division.

5K Age Brackets in Men’s and Women’s Divisions:

10 & under, 11-13, 14-18, 19-24, 25-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60 & up

9:00 AM – 1-Mile Fun Run: Kids ages 12 and under can participate. All kids that register and participate in the Fun Run will be given a participation ribbon. Age Brackets for youth mile: 5 & under, 6-8, 9-10, 11-12, award for overall top male and female finishers.

9:10 AM - FREE Kids Stormin’ Pointer Fun Dash: The Kids Stormin’ Pointer Fun Dash run starts at the High School Track just east of the CPU High School. Free race, ribbon and treat for all 10 years and younger! Registration for the Kids Stormin’ Pointer is not necessary. When parents arrive on race day, they will be required to sign a release before their child can run. The runners will run when their age group is called.

BULLETIN NO. 17 Kadyn's Law – Iowa School Bus Safety

In 2012, the Iowa Legislature unanimously adopted Kadyn's law. The law was in response to the death of seven-year-old name Kadyn Jade Halverson who was struck by a pickup and killed while trying to cross the road to board a school bus.

The driver of the pickup violated Iowa's stop arm law, which prohibits drivers from passing a stopped schools bus when the stop arms are out, or when the red or amber lights are flashing.

Kadyn's law increased the criminal penalties for passing a stopped school bus and increased the license sanctions for these offenses. Under Kadyn's law an individual who is convicted of failing to stop for a School Bus Stop Arm will be subjected to the following punishment for unlawful passing of a school bus under Iowa Code section 321.372(5)(b):

First Offense – A fine of at least \$250.00 but not more than \$675.00, and/or imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, and a 30 day license suspension.

Second Offense – (in five years) A fine of at least \$315.00, but not more than \$1,875.00, and/or imprisonment not to exceed one year, and a 90 day license suspension.

Third Offense – (in five years) A fine of at least \$315.00, but not more than \$1,875.00, and/or imprisonment not to exceed one year, and a 180 day license suspension.

Violations resulting in injury or death have increases fines and increased periods of suspension. Iowa Code § 321.482A.

Other offenses not affected by Kadyn's law could be applicable in a case involving a violation of the law resulting in injury or death. The possible charges and penalties for those violations are listed below.

Serious Injury by Vehicle – A Class D felony – is punishable by up to five years imprisonment, a fine of at least \$750.00 but not more than \$7500.00, surcharges and court costs and a one year license suspension.

Homicide by Vehicle while Intoxicated – A Class B Felony – is punishable by a mandatory 25 years imprisonment, fines, surcharges and court costs and a six year license suspension.

Homicide by Vehicle Reckless/Eluding – A Class C Felony – is punishable by up to 10 years imprisonment, a fine of at least \$1000.00 but not more than \$10,000.00, surcharges and court costs and a one year license suspension.

IS THE LAW WORKING?

School bus drivers in the state have expressed increased frustration with the lack of enforcement of Kady's law throughout the state. In survey conducted by the National Association of State Directors of Pupil Transportation Services (NASDPTS) in 2016, Iowa bus drivers were asked to keep track of violations for one day. The 1,200 drivers who responded recorded 165 bus stop violations just in that one day.

Any one of those violations could have resulted in serious injury or death of a student.
